What is EUSALP?

A macroregional strategy strives to find common solutions for common challenges in a defined area. It is a strategic approach at transnational level.

Turn the 3 No's of the EU-Commission into opportunities:

- No new structures -> better cooperation in a mulitlevel-governance approach.
- No new legislation -> better alignement of exisiting policies.
- No new funding -> better coordination of existing fundings

A bit of history:

- Initiated by impetus from the alpine regions starting from 2011 («bottom up»).
- Elaboration of an action plan and adoption of this action plan in 2015.
- Start of implementation based on the action plan in 2016. Rotating presidencies: SLO (2016), BAY (2017), Tyrol (2018), RLO (2019), FR (2020-21), ...

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

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Policy Recommendations for Cross-border Mobility





Cross-border mobility in the Alpine Region Co-financed by the European Union through the Alpine Region Preparatory Action Fund (ARPAF)

- Create a homogenous, Alpine wide statistical database
 on cross-border commuting
- Install an institutional Alpine political dialogue on crossborder commuting
- Improve cross-border infrastructure networks
- Improve services in existing cross-border networks
- Abolish negative regulatory frameworks or at least try to search for special arrangements
- Encourage cross-border spatial and mobility planning as well as management
- Reap the benefits of digitalization in transport & mobility
- Awareness-raising & behavior change

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Project labelling

- From 2017-2020, AG4 developed a methodology allowing for the assessment of projects in the transport and mobility sector according to pre-defined criteria
- The developed methodology serves to identify projects with a relevance for the fostering of sustainable mobility solutions in the Alpine Region from a macroregional perspective.
- A first round of assessments was finalised in 2020, generating a set of 14 projects receiving the EUSALP AG4 Label
- The awarded EUSALP AG4 Label shall support the projects in their implementation and to attract adequate financial support
- 2nd call for projects open (deadline 27/05/2021)

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Alternative fuels and propulsion systems

- In 2020, EUSALP AG4 launched a new activity on AF and propulsion systems
- A study have been realized to have as complete as possible an overview and a map
- We organized two seminars on the topic to share the best pratcices, and to identify ways to collaborate, funding opprtunities and factor for success
- The need for a specific EU funding program for AF refuelling station outside the TEN-T core network, particularly in mountain areas, has been highlighted
